CLAUDE'S STORY

Claude first started sailing at the age of 11, in an Optimist and P-Class at the Torbay Yacht Club. He was a natural athlete and did well, winning trophies from his very first race. Later, as an adult he went on to sail Lasers.

Claude was a huge fan of Formula One racing and chose to complete an Electronic Engineering degree at Massey University so that he could race Formula Fords with Richard Lester at Manfield. While at university, he was a member of the Massey rowing team and he got keenly involved in mountaineering, climbing all the North Island peaks and traversing the length of the Southern Alps.

After getting his mountaineering gear stolen, he decided to take up multi-sport. Claude had always been a keen cyclist but found he really enjoyed the paddling component. Claude's earliest multisport events included the Moehau Man and the Motu Challenge. Thereafter all his spare time was taken up with training and events, with particular emphasis on road cycling, mountain biking and orienteering.

In 2004 while training for the one day Coast to Coast he was diagnosed with autoimmune problems which severely curtailed his sporting activities. Nevertheless he continued as best he could, partaking in events all over NZ including The Lake Taupo Cycle Challenge, Contact Epic Challenge and Great Southern Brevet. He also completed the Crocodile Trophy in Australia and the Trans-Portugal Garmin.

Claude chose to live in West Auckland to be close to the Waitakere Ranges where he could go cycling and running and where he was close to many places to go paddling.

Although passionate about the outdoors, health and exercise, he tragically suffered a fatal heart attack in October 2016, aged 41.



NEW CLUB BOATS

Three “new” kayaks were recently added to the club fleet after they were repaired and/or refurbished. All three were donated in as-is condition but are as good as new now.

The boats are: Ruahine Exalibur Multisport, donated to the club by Claude’s family (see story in this newsletter) ; a JKK Eclipse Multisport, and a top end advanced Sharp 6.5. The Eclipse and Sharp were expertly repaired by Ding King.

In addition, three brand new kayaks are on order thanks to funding and top-up from club funds. They are expected to arrive towards end of September/early October – just in time for spring/summer!

- Fibreglass boats must NOT be taken on rocky rivers.
- Any club boat that does not have a flip-up rudder on the stern (back) of the kayak must NOT be used on Grade 1 or Grade 2 rivers

Club Hire Rules

- You must fill out the online form or contact the Club President – Vaughan Reed 021 612 753
- Pay for the hire before you take the boat and accessories.

As this is not a commercial venture but a service to the club members, we request that you report any damage to the boat or accessory equipment to the President immediately upon return of hire.

- Neglecting to do this will affect your right to hire equipment in the future.
- If any damage to club gear occurs during the period of your hire you must pay for the repairs.
